- **Confirmation & First Holy Communion:** Sunday, April 30th, 11 a.m. Mass with Bishop Silva presiding.

BISHOP SILVA EPISCOPAL VISIT TO HOLY FAMILY: Every few years, Bishop Larry Silva visits each parish throughout the diocese. His episcopal visit to Holy Family is scheduled for the weekend of **March 11 – 12, 2023**. He will preach at each of our weekend Masses, and he will also be available for a “Town Hall” after our **11 a.m. Mass on Sunday, March 12th** (Town Hall to begin approximately at 12:15 p.m.). STATIONS OF THE CROSS: Hungry on Friday evening? Join us every Friday in Lent at 6:30 p.m. for Stations of the Cross at Holy Family. A few families have volunteered to also provide sandwiches for fellowship afterwards on the Church lanai.

DIOCESE OF HONOLULU 2023 LENTEN REGULATIONS:

Fasting: In the dioceses in the United States, Catholics aged

18 through 59 are bound to fast on both Ash Wednesday (February 22nd, 2023) and Good Friday (April 7th, 2023). To fast means to consume one full meal a day at most, although taking of other, smaller quantities of food at the other customary mealtimes is permitted. Food and drink between meals (excepting water and medicine) is not permitted on days of fasting.

Abstinence from meat: Catholics aged 14 and up are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday. To abstain means refraining from eating beef, veal, pork, or poultry at least, although eggs and milk products are acceptable. The consumption of fish and shellfish is permitted, though the penitential character of the abstinence should be kept in mind.

Easter duty: All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. This precept is to be fulfilled during the Easter Season unless it is fulfilled, for a just cause, at some other time during the year. This period is extended to include all the weeks of Lent and the Easter Season up to Trinity Sunday (June 4th, 2023).

Lenten practices: The faithful are encouraged during Lent to attend daily Mass, receive Holy Communion, participate in penance services, and receive sacramental absolution; to take part in public and private exercises of piety, give generously to works of religion and charity, perform acts of kindness toward the sick, aged, and the poor; to practice voluntary self-denial, especially regarding food, drink, and worldly amusements; and to pray more fervently, particularly for the intentions of the Holy Father.
